

AGILE WITH KANBAN

Note: This class includes a pre-work video course that takes about 90 minutes to complete. This pre-work contains an overview of agile as well as Scrum (which is not the overall focus of this class, however it provides a primer and foundation for many of the concepts). Completing this work before class allows us to get into more depth in the onsite portion of the class. You will get a link to this 7-10 days before the class.

Agile with Kanban training covers all aspects of kanban, an agile method and aspects of Lean, where kanban is rooted. Kanban is often used by teams or groups who are working in IT operations, support, and DevOps as well as people who are looking to use agile outside of IT, throughout the organization (e.g. marketing, sales, HR, manufacturing, etc.)

COURSE OVERVIEW

The course covers the difference between the agile mindset and just "doing agile." The course starts by focusing on understanding what types of situations agile works in and why. Building on this foundation, we dig into the details of Kanban. Learn how to manage shifting priorities, focus, and deliver quality work as an organization. This course is designed for people looking for better ways to deliver value to customers, work together, learn, and support other team members.

SPECIFICALLY, THE COURSE COVERS:

- What types of situations agile adds value to and why
- Being agile vs. doing agile – what this means in practice
- Agile values and principles
- Scrum overview - Scrum, another agile approach, is important to understand in order to work and engage with teams who are using it as well as comparing Scrum and kanban
- Lean principles and kanban values supporting collaboration and performance
- How to identify and tackle impediments to flow with the Theory of Constraints
- The core elements of kanban and it's practical application in teams and organizations
- How to design a kanban system (including kanban boards and cards) to gain valuable insights and optimize outcomes
- Learn how planning and forecasting work in kanban systems
- Understand metrics and charts that can help you assess performance and identify improvements
- Realize how kanban can be used to identify and make a case to remove organizational constraints
